Beans and Pulses Monthly Report May 2012

Report Highlights:

Burma exported 209,040 metric tons (MT) of beans and pulses in May, an increase of 33 percent from the same period in 2011. Of this total, 60 percent went to India or 125,671 MT, followed by Singapore with 14 percent or 29,752 MT, and Vietnam six percent or 13,259 MT. Year—to-date exports for 2012 are 700,523 MT, 42 percent greater than last year's 493,986 MT.

General Information:

Burma's beans and pulses exports in May, 2012 totaled 209,040 MT, up 33 percent from 156,987 MT in May 2011. Matpe (black gram) accounted for 44 percent of the total exports, followed by mung bean 24 percent and toor whole 17 percent. Year –to-date exports for 2012 are 700,523 MT, 42 percent greater than last year with 493,986 MT. India and Singapore were the largest buyers accounting for 125,671 MT or 60 percent, and 29,752 MT or 14 percent of total exports, respectively.

Export prospects

Month to month exports of beans and pulses were greater than last year as exports increased 33 percent from 156,987 MT in 2011 to 209,040 MT in 2012 due to strong demand from India. Year –to-date exports for 2012 are 700,523 MT, 42 percent greater than last year with 493,986 MT. Production continues to increase as farmers have shifted their cultivation preference to beans and pulses from rice during the summer season, as these have generated higher returns. It is expected that total production this year will be 4.7 MMT a 6 percent increase from 2011.
